It's Smoky Out There!

We will continue to offer to students with respiratory issues the option of staying indoors while we are dealing with these poor air conditions. As we have done in the past, if our air quality is Moderate (yellow) respiratory kids will be given the option to go outside or stay inside; if air quality is Unhealthy for Sensitive Groups (orange) respiratory kids will stay in, and if the air quality is Unhealthy (red), Very Unhealthy (purple) or Hazardous (maroon) all kids will stay in. If we are in the red, purple or maroon zones, all kids will be inside, and we will conduct indoor recess. If your child has been identified as a student with respiratory concerns, as identified by the child's health records, the child will not be allowed to go out if the air quality zone is orange or worse. If your child is upset with this, we will call you to get your perspective (some parents are ok with their child going out when we are in the orange zone and some are not). With regards to open windows, we will most likely have windows in the morning to get some cool air in the building and will then close them as it gets too hot/smoky outside.

Emergency Drills

During September and October, we will have several emergency drills (fire, earthquake, shelter in place and how to re-enter the building practice). These drills will then occur less frequently throughout the year. Please help us by explaining the need for these drills to your children and talking about safety and following adult directions.

PLEASE NOTE: Our playground coverage, on the South playground, begins at

8:15am on in-school days. Students need to stay out on the South playground in their zones until the bell rings at 8:45am. The only exceptions are when we have temperatures below zero (actual temperature and/or wind chill), or atmospheric smoke that is at unhealthy levels. On these days we will have students sit in their classroom, while maintaining social distancing within family groups.

We are invested in ensuring your child returns safely to your home after the school day. We ask that you please plan for your child to be picked up by **2:40 on Monday**, **Tuesday**, **Thursday**, **and Friday**.
