### EVEN DURING A PANDEMIC, KIDS NEED HALLOWEEN!

Many of our Jefferson traditions have been temporarily set aside this last spring and autumn. Halloween is such a magical time for little people... It will not be the same as in years' past, but our Jefferson ghouls, witches, warlocks, and goblins will have their day! On October 27<sup>th,</sup> our A-Cohort students, and on October 30<sup>th</sup> our B-Cohort students will celebrate Halloween! (DLI students will have their own DLI opportunity which is forthcoming.) In order to adhere with the safety regulations necessary in this C-19 environment, students will need to comply with costume requirements. We also understand that many in our community are struggling financially. We do not want to add a fiscal burden where there need not be one! So, what will Halloween look like at Jefferson this year?

- Students will be invited come to school in their Halloween outfit for the day. They may choose to wear a Halloween costumes, PJ's, or Halloween clothes, or their regular clothes any and all are fine! Whatever they wear they need to be able to navigate without adult assistance (i.e. go to the restroom independently).
- Students will not be able to wear any face paint or Halloween masks, or hats/headgear. They still need to manage and wear their C-19 mask independently. (no masks over masks)
- Students may not wear gloves or hand coverings; they will still need to be able to wash their hands.
- As always, costumes should be appropriately themed for an elementary school environment.
- Students are welcome, but not required to bring individually commercially wrapped treats for each child in their Family Group or class (K-2 will celebrate in Family Groups, 3<sup>rd</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> may celebrate in classes). Your child's teacher will be sending home more details.

Your child's teachers will have a day of Halloween themed fun to celebrate their school Halloween day! It should be a good day for all!

Also, I have attached some suggested activities for families, as the CDC is not recommending door to door trick or treating this year. We want to do all we can to keep your child and family healthy, and hope you find these to be useful.
